

Child Safety Training



Overview	Learn why it is important to learn about child sexual abuse, today more than ever. Introduction to learning how to protect children and assure the health and well-being of your organization.	
Lesson 1	Introduction	Covers long-term impacts, historical perspective, overview of legislation, the impact on organizations, and how-to focus on child sexual abuse prevention.
Lesson 2	Definition Of Child Sexual Abuse	Covers the questions of what is child sexual abuse, what is non-sexual abuse or neglect, some facts about child sexual abuse, who are the victims and perpetrators, what causes child sexual abuse, classes of child molesters, why the number of reported cases is so low, and how children should be warned.
Lesson 3	Victim Behavioral Characteristics	Covers the profiles of potential victims, physical signs or behaviors, behavior or signs of mental stress, the perpetrator at work, and how to heed the warning signs.
Lesson 4	Effects Of Child Sexual Abuse	Covers the effects on the victim, effects in adulthood, and effects on the family.
Lesson 5	Characteristics Of Child Molesters	Covers historical view, how do predators choose their victims, grooming behaviors, what should you be on the lookout for, common characteristics of male offenders and common characteristics of female offenders.
Lesson 6	Recognizing Behaviors	Covers how to watch for grooming behaviors, supervise everyone, avoid false allegations, avoid unmonitored or unsupervised situations, watch for inappropriate physical contact, and to monitor the children.
Lesson 7	Prevention	Covers establishing a child sexual abuse prevention program planning committee, creating screening and selection policies for employees and volunteers, writing guidelines about interactions between individuals, avoiding unmonitored one-on-one monitor behavior, watching for grooming behaviors in others, protecting yourself: avoid false allegations, avoiding inappropriate physical affection, providing a safe environment, response to situations, provide training, and manage changes.
Lesson 8	Reporting Child Sexual Abuse	Covers when you should report, role of policies and procedures, reporting processes, and keeping records of internal reports.
